Welcome and call to order: Chairwoman Alyce Spruell called the meeting to order at 11:07 a.m. and welcomed committee members, staff, and guests.

Acknowledgment of authorization for online meeting: Chairwoman Spruell acknowledged that the hybrid-format board meeting was held in compliance with Act 2022-421.

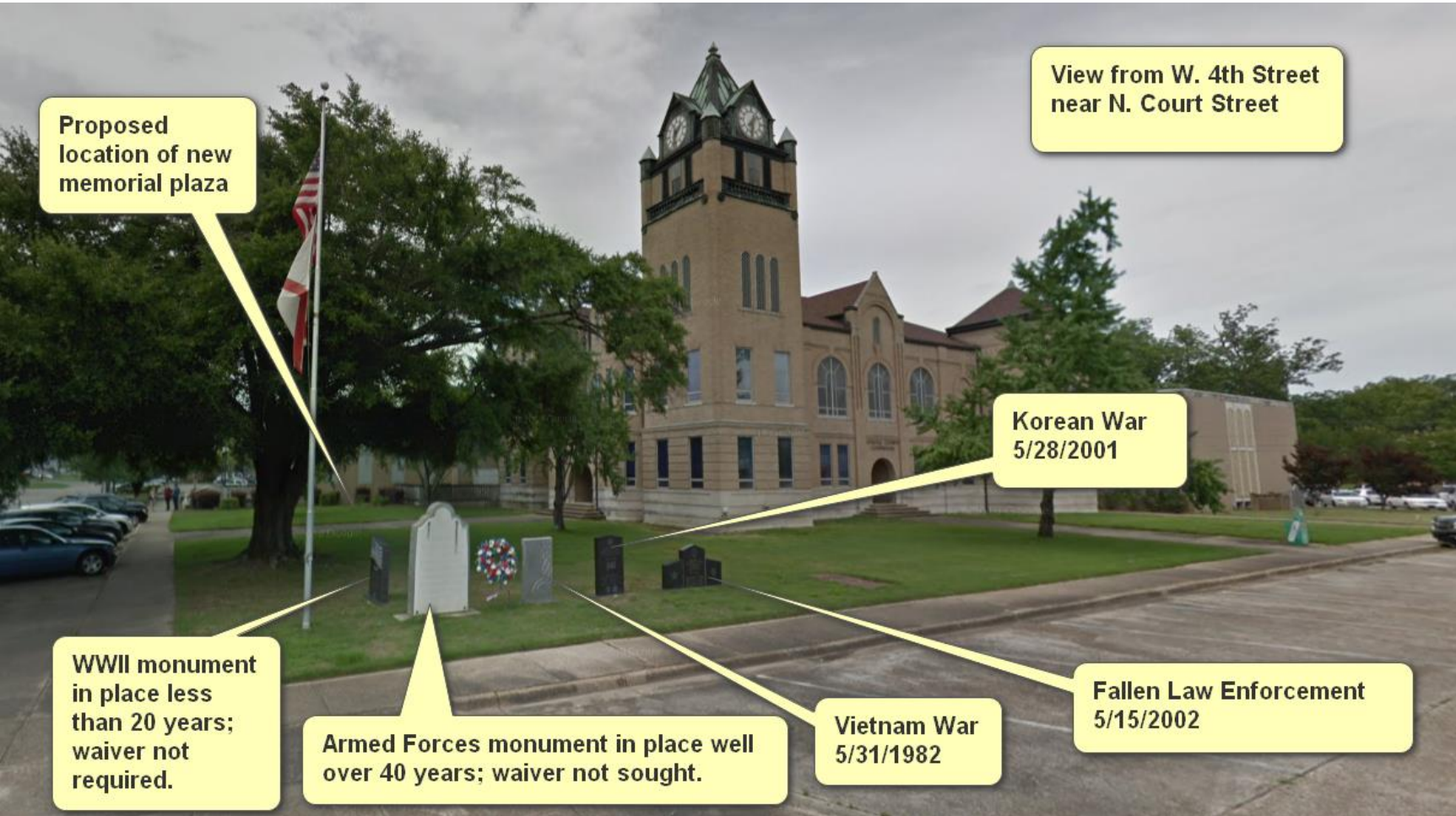

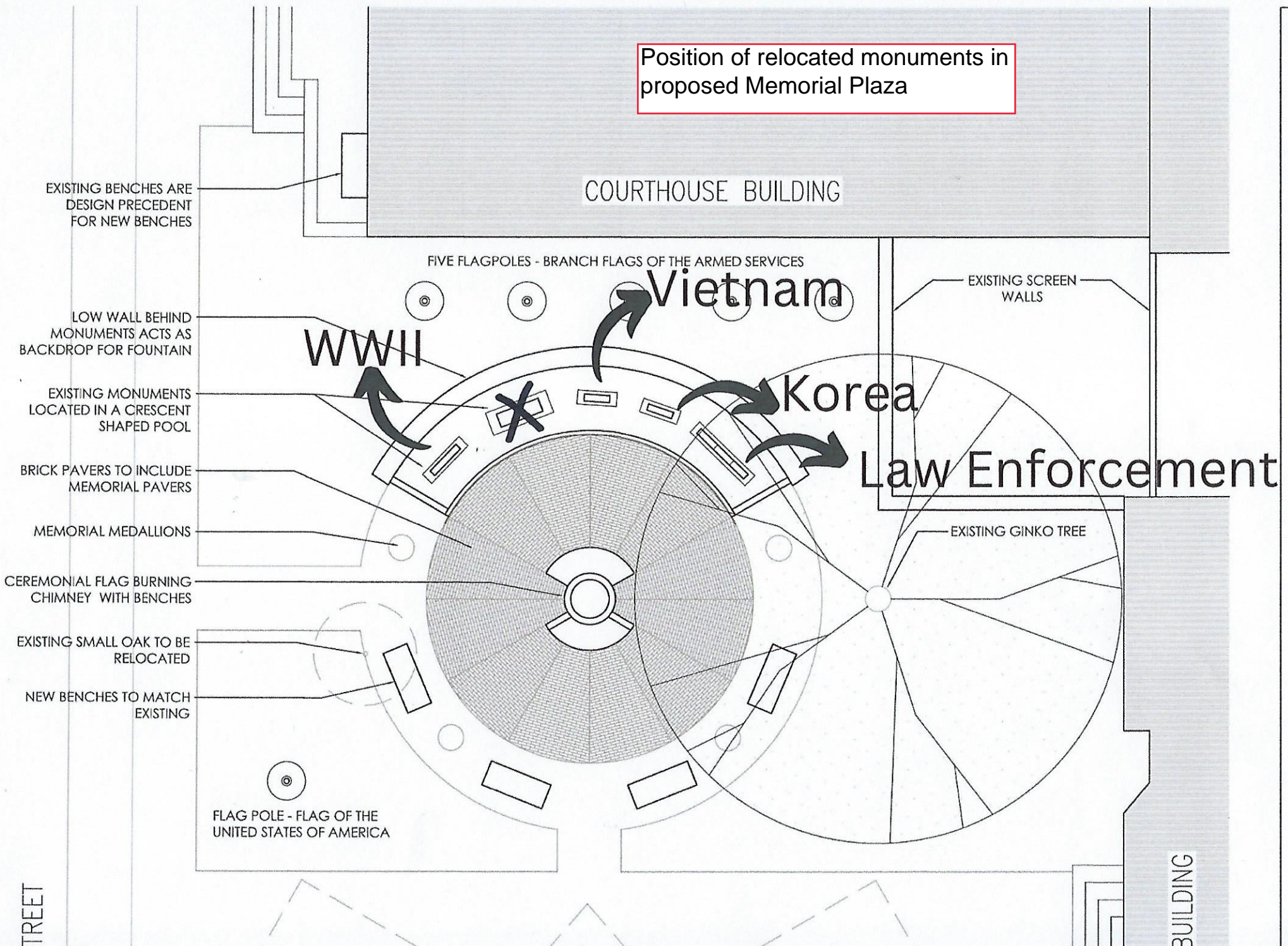

SEEKING A WAIVER FROM THE ALABAMA COMMITTEE ON ALABAMA
MONUMENT PROTECTION

WHEREAS, Jonathan Hancock approached the Autauga County Commission regarding moving certain monuments at the Autauga County Courthouse from a haphazard placement along the sidewalk to a place within a Veteran's Monument Plaza; and

WHEREAS, the Autauga County Commission is in favor of Jonathan's project moving forward; and

WHEREAS, the construction of the Veteran's Plaza will require the relocation of monuments that have been in place for more than twenty years and less than forty years; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Alabama Memorial Preservation Act of 2017, these monuments cannot be relocated without a waiver from the Committee on Alabama Monument Protection; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on July 19, 2022 seeking public comment; and

WHEREAS, the monuments subject to the waivers honor citizens of Autauga County that served in foreign wars; and


WHEREAS, the relocation of these monuments to the Veteran's Plaza is supported by the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars; and

WHEREAS, the relocation of these monuments is moving from placement along a sidewalk to a placement of prominence within the Veteran's Plaza to be constructed at the same location.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Autauga County Commission seeks a waiver from the Committee on Alabama Monument Protection for relocation of these monuments that have been in place for more than twenty years, but less than forty years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any and all necessary representatives of the Autauga County Commission are authorized and directed to execute and deliver, or attest a signature required on, any document reasonably necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution.





WAIVER APPLICATION GUIDELINES & COVER FORM

The Alabama Memorial Preservation Act of 2017 prohibits the relocation, removal, alteration, renaming, or other disturbance of any architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument located on public property which has been in place for 40 years or more. The Act provides a waiver process for the relocation, removal, alteration, renaming, or other disturbance of any architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, or monument located on public property which has been in place for at least 20 years and less than 40 years, and also provides a waiver process for the renaming of a memorial school which is located on public property and has been so situated for 20 or more years. At a minimum, submission of this completed form and attachments constitutes a request for review by the Committee on Alabama Monument Protection (CAMP). The responsibility for preparing this application and all attachments rests with the Controlling Entity that has legal control of the public property on which the architecturally significant building, memorial building, memorial street, monument, or memorial school sits. A Technical Advisory Review Group (TARG) appointed by the Committee shall review the application, verify its compliance with administrative rules, and make recommendations based on the historical and technical scope of the application. The TARG's ability to complete a timely review depends on the quality of the material submitted.

NOTE: The Committee's administrative rules (*Alabama Administrative Code* 584-X-1) provides for a 90-day response time by the Committee following the submittal deadline. A schedule of Committee meetings and deadlines is available at www.CAMP.alabama.gov.

 - Additional information is required for the evaluation of the application.
 - A determination has been made that a waiver is not required for the proposed modification.
 - A determination has been made that the proposed modification is not eligible for a waiver and the application will not be considered by the Committee.
 - The application has been placed on an agenda for consideration by the Committee.

What Happens Next?

- The Technical Advisory Review Group (TARG) will acknowledge receipt of the application package and will evaluate the application for completeness and eligibility for consideration.
- The Controlling Entity will receive notification of one of the following:
 - Additional information is required for the evaluation of the application.
 - A determination has been made that a waiver is not required for the proposed modification.
 - A determination has been made that the proposed modification is not eligible for a waiver and the application will not be considered by the Committee.
 - The application has been placed on an agenda for consideration by the Committee.

Local architect, Larry Smith, helped me to begin the planning phase.

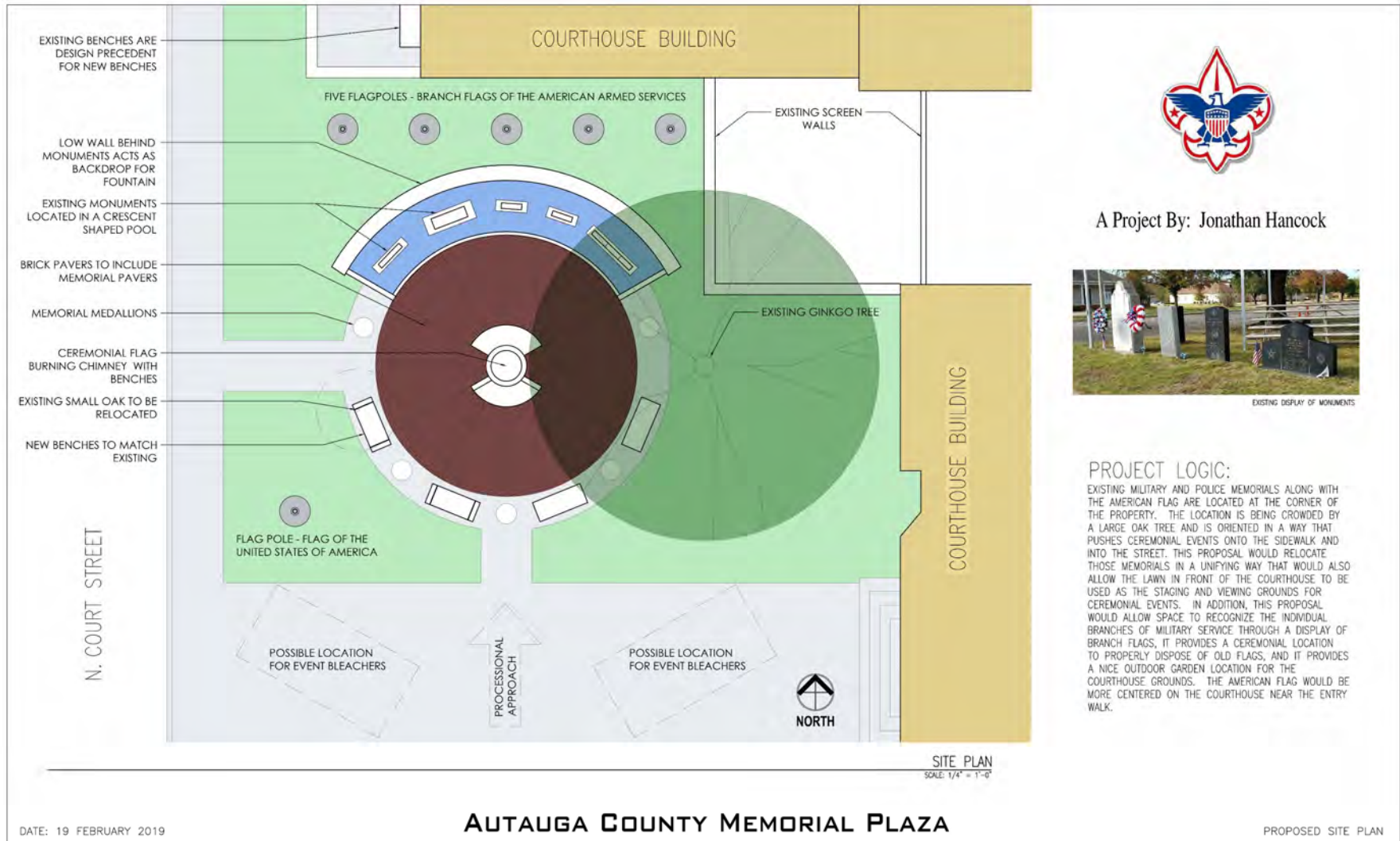
He suggested that I make a detailed list of all of the specific elements that I would like to have included in the design for the plaza and send it to him so he could begin laying out the design.

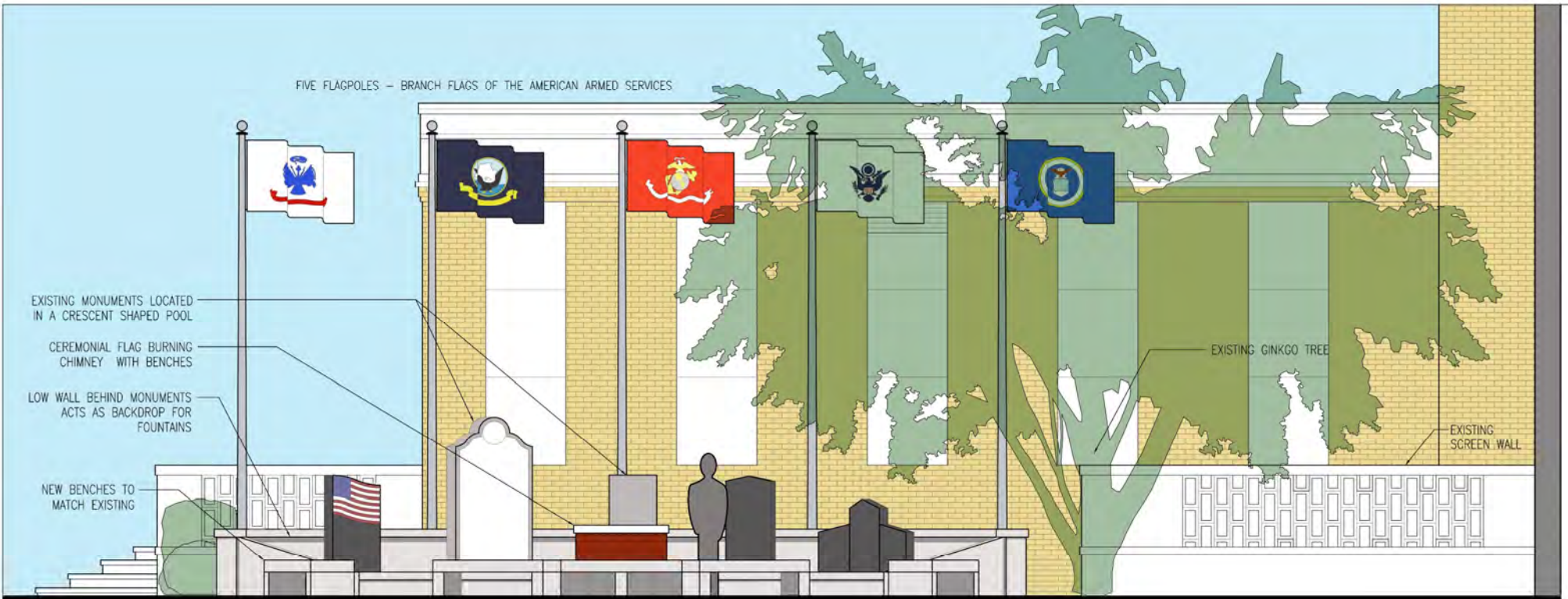

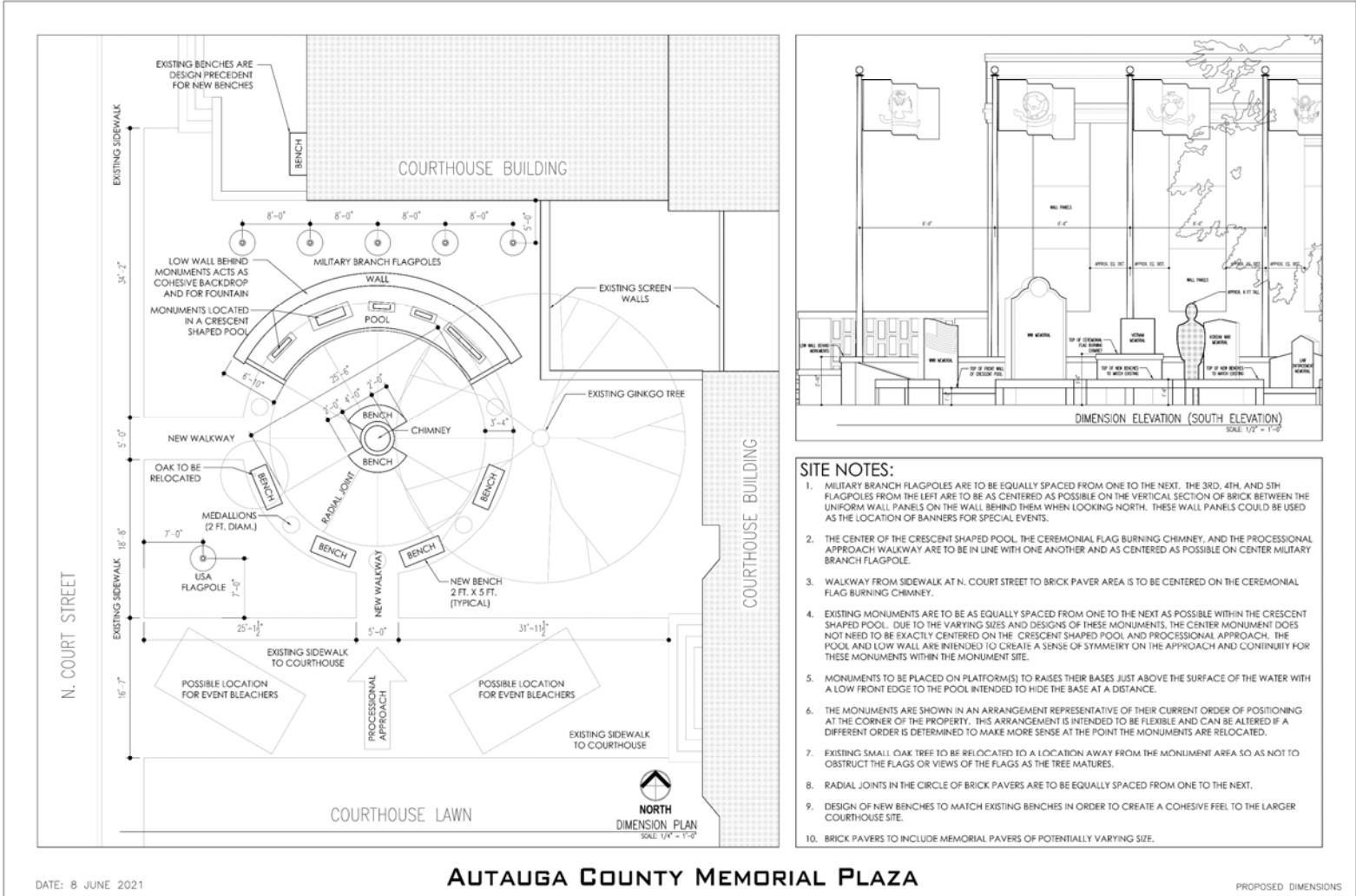

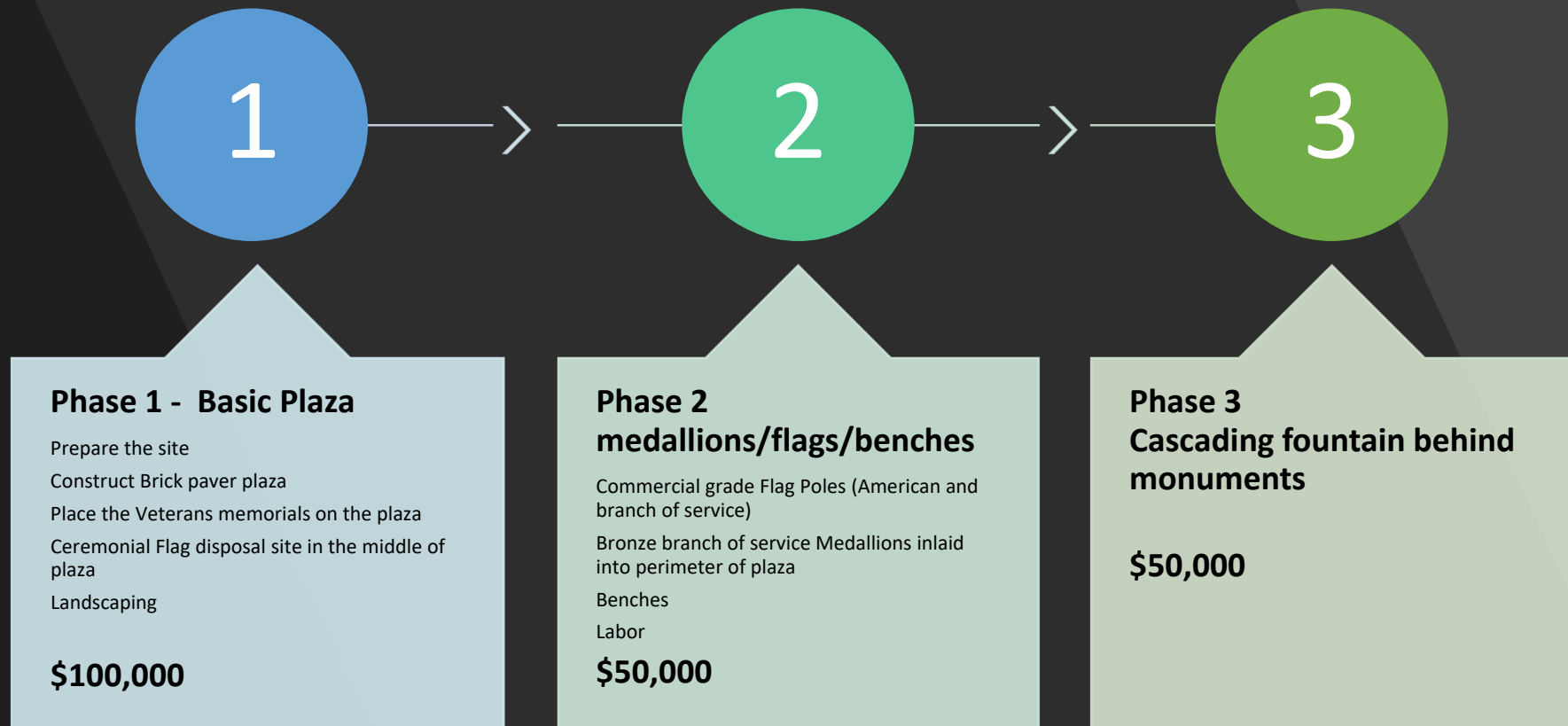
